### COURSE DESCRIPTION

The study of International Relations examines, discusses, and analyzes from a political and socio-cultural perspective the relationships between states and various other issues that develop at national, regional, and global levels. In IULI the course is taught through structured exposure to politics, history, economics, as well as philosophy, sociology, anthropology and other disciplines of social sciences and the humanities. The interdisciplinary approach adopted by IULI's Department of International Relations provides connections between social phenomena and technology.

In line with Department's motto of "Progressive, Critical, Humanist" (in Indonesian: *Kritis, Progresif, Humanis*), the Department aims to nurture students *who* constantly assess situations in a critical way, *who* integrate knowledge and methodology in approaching problems, and *who* think locally and globally.

IULI's International Relations students are trained to acquaint themselves with numerous and complex subject areas. They are also encouraged to independently develop strategies for solving collective problems that often extend beyond borders. Graduates will possess sound knowledge and methods in studying international affairs and be constantly aware of the requirements of socially responsible and critical actions.
